

▶ The mouth of the Neretva River, just outside of Metković, is the favourite destinations for surfers who sail with kites instead of sails. Thus, it comes as no surprise that this year's regatta season will be opened by kite surfers at that very spot. The "Neretva Open 2017" regatta, which is also the Croatian Kiteboarding Championship, is scheduled for 22 June and it is an open-type event so the event organisers have already announced numerous guests.

- Over thirty kiteboarders

have already signed up and it is interesting to note that one of the contestants is from Brazil and another one a Frenchman with a Dubai address. In addition to local kiteboarders, contestants will also come from Italy, Slovenia, Switzer-

land, Portugal and Monaco – as we were told by Kitesurf Split Club members who are hosting the event.

There will be two disciplines: the first one is called freestyling, that is, jumping and flying high, where conte-

stants will try to impress the judges with their acrobatic stunts. The second discipline is a course race hydrofoil, which means sailing a prescribed route as fast as possible.

Since the sandbank of the Neretva River mouth is a true paradise for kiteboarders, both amateurs and professionals, the kiteboarding caravan will surely attract a large number of kiteboarding fans. And after the exciting and interesting competition is over, the party will simply be transferred back to the mainland where there will be plenty of good music and partying.

DO NOT MISS! CHURCH OF ST. SYLVESTER IN POLJE DATING FROM THE 11TH CENTURY

This is a hidden jewel with crystal clear sea, untouched by modern busy life, into the deep sea. You can enjoy the food and the famous premium wine Plavac, but also swim in Porat Beach which has been included among the seven most beautiful beaches in the world. But the island is, of course, most famous for its Blue Cave. When the sea is peaceful, at around noon the rays of the sun penetrate into the Blue Cave through an underwater opening, reflect from the white bottom and illuminate the cave in blue and its objects in silver. Due to not being deep and its underwater cracks, the cave is suitable for divers of all categories.

THE RED CLIFFS ABOVE KOMIŽA WITH TWELVE CLIMBING DIRECTIONS MARKED ON THEM AND A TUNNEL WITH ITS FIRST EXIT AT 30 METRES. THE DIRECTIONS ARE ADAPTED TO PHYSICAL FITNESS AND EXPERIENCE.





▶▶ The Croatian Theatre is one of the first municipal theatres in Europe and founded in 1612. It was erected over the Arsenal (a space for returning galleys and warehouse for all maritime supplies). The outer appearance of the theatre has mainly been preserved in its original form while the interior architecture is from the 19th century.



▶▶ Fortica Fortress (Španjola) was built on a hill above the old part of the town in the mid-16th century. You will not only be thrilled by its architecture and its military history, but you will enjoy the stunning view of the town of Hvar, its surroundings and the nearby islands.





## how to get there

### **BOAT**

THERE ARE TWO FERRYBOAT LINES TO THE ISLAND OF HVAR: STARI GRAD AND SUĆURAJ. THE STARI GRAD PORT HAS A CONNECTION WITH SPLIT AND IT IS CLOSER TO HVAR (20 KM), AND THE TRIP TO THE TOWN OF HVAR LASTS FOR ABOUT TEN MINUTES. THE ROAD FOLLOWS THE MAGNIFICENT SOUTHERN COASTLINE OF THE ISLAND.

▶▶ The Benedictine convent on Hvar has existed since 1664 when two nuns came here from Pag. The convent is famous throughout the world for its agave laces, which are attended to only in this convent and the tradition has been cherished for 100-130 years being passed from one generation to the other.

▶▶ Baška Voda is located in the centre of the Makarska Riviera. It has just a bit less than three thousand inhabitants and covers the area of 20 square kilometres, the major part of which is the beach. This is the town where Mount Biokovo meets the sea and the rich tourist offer has something for everyone. Apart from the archaeological museum and the permanent shellfish exhibition, you can visit numerous events such as the BMX stunt festival, concerts at the waterfront and boat excursions.



### 1 Play football on Mount Biokovo

Just fifteen minutes by foot from the centre of Baška Voda in the direction of Mount Biokovo, you will come across an area called Greben. It is one of the sites where the planetary popular "Game of Thrones" show was filmed. When there are no film crews around, it also hosts a playing field with two goals where you can play football, basketball and many other sports you may like.

## 2 Hike to the most beautiful mountain tops

Mount Biokovo has a total of 15 hiking trails, some of the most beautiful ones being located above the town of Baška Voda. These mountain tops offer a magnificent view of the entire Makarska Riviera. For information about the trails, contact the Tourism Board or the Sveti Ilija Hiking Club. They also offer a chance to take some fabulous selfies.



## 3 BMX Bicycle Stunt Festival

Each summer the Baška Voda waterfront hosts the spectacular BMX Festival gathering the best extreme cyclists from all over the world. Stunts on two wheels with jumps into the air and into the sea from ramps are once again in store this year as part of a multi-day programme which will include an international competition.

## 5 Blue flag awarded kilometres long beaches

Let us not forget a few kilometres of pebbled and sandy beaches stretching along the town's coast. The most famous beach is called "Nikolina" and is located in the very town centre. It has received many prestigious international awards. In addition to the Nikolina Beach, the surrounding beaches have also been awarded the blue flag, which symbolises clean sea and environment.



## 6 Rent a boat with your friends and sail away

Rent a small boat that doesn't need special permits and licenses and sail away with your friends. Enjoy a beautiful sunset, a glass of cold local wine and visit the surrounding towns. Also, you can rent a parachute and a speedboat and observe the coast from the sea.







# Fort Saint Michael

## The view & The Fun

The Fortress is the oldest inhabited area of the city, so it makes sense to begin the whole story about the history and development of Šibenik right here, at the Fortress

▶ The fortress of St. Michael in Šibenik was built on a 60 meter high limestone hill, situated at the mouth of the river Krka. This is the place where the life of Šibenik began. The building

of the present-day fortress lasted from the 13th to the 18th century but its biggest part belongs to the 15th and 16th century. Its ground plan has the shape of an irregular quadrangle. In the eastern

part of the fortress there are two well preserved square mural towers and there are two polygonal towers in its northern part. The Gothic style main entrance is situated on the eastern side. During

the archeological excavations inside the fortress territory, numerous objects, dating from the prehistoric period to the Middle Ages, were uncovered. According to the historical sources from the 12th century, inside the fortress walls there was the church of St. Michael.

Along the course of its history, the fortress was damaged and rebuild several times. It was demolished twice, in 1663 and in 1752 by the explosion of the powder-magazines situated within its walls. There is a double defensive wall descending from the fortress to the coast and ending with the big Gothic gate. It was built at the beginning of the 15th century and, in danger, the soldiers used it to retreat towards the sea.

## MALI LOŠINJ, THE ISLAND OF LOŠINJ

### THE APOXYOMENOS MUSEUM

The Museum of Apoxyomenos was opened last year in the town of Mali Lošinj, on the island bearing the same name. The main exhibit is the statue of Apoxyomenos, antique bronze athlete that had been found in the waters around the island. This impressive and well-preserved statue is 192 centimetres tall, found in 1997 in the waters between the Vele Orjule and Lošinj islands; it was taken out in 1999.

The bronze statute dates back to 1-2 ct. BC. It is assumed that it ended up in the Lošinj waters after fierce Kvarner bora wind hit a boat. At that time Kvarner was on the ancient Adriatic route going through the ancient Liburnian town of Osor, separating the islands of Cres and Lošinj. The route was in fact connecting ancient Dalmatia and Istria. The apoxyomenos is the only large bronze monument found so far on the east coast of the Adriatic, and in the last several years it has become a symbol of the Croatian culture heritage and an extraordinary achievement of restaurateurs.



▶▶ Kvarner takes pride in its maritime heritage, encountered in every town on the coast and on the islands. Regattas have been organised in Kvarner for ages, and the inhabitants have joined forces with neighbouring Slovenia to keep the tradition alive.

Mala barka regatta has been developed with the aim of creating a new tourist product based on maritime tradition, a part of IPA Slovenia-Croatia cross border programme of valorising maritime, fishing and ship-building tradition in the North Adriatic. Mala barka is traditional sailing boats regatta held in ports along Kvarner. It is only natural to include a rich maritime history in tourist offer, so Croatia and Slovenia have come to the idea of organising traditional Kvarner regattas. The area on both sides of the border, i.e. Slovenian Primorje, Istria and Kvarner is one of the most attractive tourist destinations of both countries. Mala barka 2 also stands for the project of preservation and touristic valorization of the maritime heritage of the Kvarner Region supported by the EU. Along with traditional regattas, maritime parades are also organised, any if you want to learn more about the rich heritage of the region make sure you visit the Maritime and History Museum in Rijeka and the Maritime Heritage Interpretation Centre in a fishing village Mošćenička Draga.

#### BELI, THE ISLAND OF CRES

### GRIFFON VULTURE CENTRE

▶▶ Beli, a place on the northern side of the Island of Cres, is well known as the home of the griffon vulture, as can be seen from the permanent exhibition dedicated to this bird of environmental and cultural significance for Cres. Last year the 1st phase of the Griffon Vulture Visitor Centre and Rehabilitation Facility was opened, featuring an aviary. The Centre greatly contributes to the protection of the environment and the vulture population. It is also a welcome addition to, and helps promote the tourism of Beli and the Cres-Lošinj and Kvarner area by providing authentic content stemming from centuries of co-existence of people and nature.

The Visitor Centre will feature an area to accommodate volunteers, students and scientists and an area for educational and workshop activities. In the 1st phase of the Centre, the visitors can see exhibition on griffon vulture.

#### VRBNIK, THE ISLAND OF KRK

### MUST-VISIT WINE AND GASTRO DESTINATION

▶▶ The Island of Krk and its picturesque town of Vrbnik are known for its glagolitic script heritage (glagoljica is an old, 9th century Slav letter; a quarter of all kept manuscripts is from Vrbnik) and home to a rich cultural tradition, but it has also become a must-visit destination for wine and food lovers visiting Kvarner. Vrbnik is situated on a steep cliff, and if you want to come closer you can do so only on foot. Vrbnik Žlahtina, produced in Vrbnik, is one of the most famous and best Croatian wines, and visitors of Kvarner can go on a tour of the vineyards and wine cellars and taste different žlahtina wines. Vrbnik is also well known for Valomer, a unique sparkling wine that matures 30 meters underground. Vrbnik is home to the first Croatian hotel dedicated to wine, and inside its walls it also hides the narrowest ally in the world – Klančić.

#### GORSKI KOTAR

### GORSKI KOTAR BIKE TOUR

▶▶ The so-called Goranska cycling transversal is a new cycling path connecting all towns and municipalities in Gorski kotar country with their natural, cultural and historical attractions and gastro delicacies. The cycling path runs along the low-traffic roads, and is intended for mountain biking aficionados.

If you take this route you will get to know all of Gorski kotar, and you can stretch it over several days of active holiday. The 260 kilometre route comprises seven sections, each between 28 and 43 kilometres long. When you add 9 more linking sections, you get more than 400 kilometres of pure pleasure on two wheels. The attractive and recognisable terrain configuration totals in more than 5000 metres of climbs and 5000 metres down-hill routes.





A vineyard sprang from nothing but rock as the continuance of what their ancestors had always produced, excellent wines. Marko continues to cherish the tradition of the Skradin region. The vineyard is magnificent with an excellent view of the island of Visovac.

The altitude above sea level is 290 m, 2000 hours of sunshine in vegetation, and limestone ground that produces white creamy mineral wines, pungent and fresh with the aroma of Dalmatian wild herbs and citrus, very drinkable. The red wines are soft, drinkable, with green pepper and sour cherry aroma.

The revival of autochthonous sorts and the discovery of their full potential is the aim of Skradin vintners.







- 2 spoonfuls olive oil and lemon juice**
- Half a teaspoonful of salt and pepper**


▶▶ Chop coarsely the vegetables and put them in a blender with the remaining ingredients: at serving drop some olive oil over it and decorate with basil leaves or small thyme branches.







The seductive ambience of the former nobility palace with exhibits most of which have been taken out of deposits for the first time and garnished with authentic three-hundred-year-old furniture, can really be exciting for everyone. Our ancestors were fashion aware and definitely fully belonged to the European cultural circle.

Boxes for hats, parasols with real feathers as well as fans are witness of the fashion of the ladies from Split and Dalmatia, and the men of the time were no worse; at least those such as the nobleman from Trogir, Ivan Luka Garanjina, who could afford a fine short coat for men of French brocade that was well sewn by a tailor – Jew in Venice. Formal men’s boots from the Lukanović Collection from Šibenik dating from the early 18th century are also proof of

the luxury and taste of the time, being decorated with gold embroidery and brocade. The ambience of the exhibition is supplemented with women's amber dresses with features of classicism from the first half of the nineteenth century when the "discipline" of the former inevitable corset started to subside; Napoleon once gave a negative comment to this change.

A catalogue in two languages is available so that visitors could take away part of

what they had seen. Clothes are the most sensitive impulse of society changes and Split possesses 225 objects that tell the story of the city's culture in dress wear and shows the cultural, political and anthropologic changes... Even though the exhibition in Split City Museum that covers the period from the early 18th (Rococo) to the mid-19th century, there are no exhibits of the "first Split trousers but there are the - knickers. According to some new scien-

tific observations, the split women invented underwear, knickers discretely decorated with flounces and down to the knee. A full wardrobe of such underwear and sleeves (naked arms was very audacious for the women of the time, an erotic detail), gloves, night caps, plastrons, handkerchiefs, corsets and other exhibited in the ambience of a simulated Split gentlemen's apartment next to a movable wooden toilet decorated with inlays, and the living room with a piano bought in 1860 for Antonjeta Kamber married Rismondo, which she brought with her dowry. Each exhibit is a curiosity but we must emphasize the plastron of Đina Katalinić from around 1880 in which she posed for Vlaho Bukovac, and remained immortalized on the portrait.

### *Hvar-Zračće* medium route

It demands average physical effort and it is considered as a route of medium difficulty. It is adequate for all types of bicycles, and, at the same time a theme trail. The climb is short to Zračće Cove, and a high percentage descent (20%) makes it a special attraction.

# Walking like the ROMANS did



## Road routes leading from Salona:

▶▶ The time machine has not been invented yet, so we cannot use it to go back in time, but with our imagination, historical facts and archaeological sites, we can set off on a journey to ancient times and set foot on the roads that were used by soldiers of the Roman legions and passengers in this region centuries ago.

The Dalmatian area is rich in cultural heritage from different historical periods, and the deepest traces were left by the period of antiquity, especially Roman times, as is the case in the other parts of the Mediterranean. The construction of a modern road infrastructure has triggered numerous archaeological researches in this area, revealing a Roman road network, the starting point of which was in Salona, which is, along with Diocletian's Palace, one of

the ancient jewels of this area.

The surviving remains of Roman roads scattered throughout the area of the Split hinterland attract many guests looking for a deeper insight into the historical heritage of the area, all while enjoying the accompanying activities, such as rafting, canoeing and a rich gastronomic panoply at the same time. They can now set out for the preserved remains of Roman roadways, which start from Salona, and find a variety of attractions all around them. For example, they can partake of the wonders of protected landscapes such as the Cetina canyon, Proložac Lake, Red and Blue Lake in Imotski, Vranjača cave, as well as the ruins of early Christian necropolises, Roman camps, religious buildings and numerous fortifications.



## *A little bit about her*

### **1** *What food did you like the most in Croatia?*

Adriatic seafood. During our one-week stay on the island of Vis, my four-year-old son, husband and I took a trip to the beautiful cove of Stončica. After taking a few dips in the water, we headed towards the Složna brothers’ tavern, Konoba Stončica. We ordered Adriatic lobster, which Pave, one of the three brothers, prepared on an open flame grill. The lobster came to our table sizzling hot, anointed with the tavern’s signature fresh herb, olive oil and garlic sauce. Sitting at our table in the garden overlooking the turquoise cove, we ate the lobster with our fingers, alongside plates of charred fresh tomatoes, capsicum and aubergine. It paired beautifully with the local chilled white wine, made from Vugava grapes. It was our most memorable meal in Croatia.

## 2 *Favorite spot to have a drink?*

Cafe Vidilica at the foot of the Marjan Hill. We trekked – slowly, with a toddler in tow – to Telegrin, the peak of the hill, which is marked by the Croatian flag. At 178m above sea level, you have gorgeous views of Split, the harbor below, and the sea around it. Café Vidilica is at the summit of the hill, where you can relax after your hike, and take in the panoramic views of Split – and the islands beyond – while enjoying a sundowner (or apricot juice, for our son).

## 3 *Best new thing/ flavor that you tried in Croatia?*

I adored makovnjača, the poppy seed paste roll, which was a new flavour for me. Every morning, while in Komiža, Vis, I walked over to the local bakery, Pekara Kolderaj, to buy a loaf of this pastry, which when cut, reveals gorgeous swirls of poppy seed paste (initially, I had thought it was chocolate, because of the colour and intense, nutty taste). One of the ladies who worked in the bakery told me that this loaf is popular during Christmas and New Year, as poppy seeds are a symbol of wealth, with the tiny seeds representing coins. My family and I had slices of the loaf with our morning caffè lattes – a perfect way to start each day before heading to the beach.



## 4 *Best travel tip to other travelers?*

Slow travel is the best. We weren't research-obsessed prior to our trip to Croatia, nor did we have a checklist of cafes, restaurants and sights noted down. I know it sounds odd in this day and (electronic) age, but it worked for us. We had a paper map (old school) and when we needed help, we asked some of my Croatian friends and other locals for tips and advice. It made for a relaxing vacation; we ate well and saw some beautiful sights – thanks to the recommendations of kind and gracious Croatians we met along the way.

## 5 *Advice for people who work in tourism in Croatia, where they can do things better?*

If I were a professional in the tourism industry in Croatia, I would like to see more projects which promote sustainable growth of the tourist industry, given that the country – the Dalmatian islands in particular – has been inundated with tourists in recent years. The industry would benefit from sustainable tourism projects which preserve the natural beauty and socio-economic foundation of the local communities.

As a side note – as someone who loves ice cream and gelato – I'd be elated to see more local ice-creameries like Luka, in Split (the rhubarb-vanilla was mine and my son's favourite), and less of the ones which sell "gelato" with neon pink food colouring.

# BIRDWATCHING

▶ If you take a tour of the salt pans in the period between March and September, you may experience a rare sight in form of a black-winged stilt. The luckiest ones may even get the bird to pose for them. Since this rare bird has made a nest next to the walking trail in the salt pans, skilled photographers may get to take some beautiful photos. The advertising campaign for the Nin EDEN destination focuses on environmental tourism with an emphasis on bird life and other sustainable forms of tourism. Thanks to its muddy and sandy shallow shores and swamp areas surrounding the saltworks, the Nin lagoon presents a unique

biological value and is an important bird habitat both for Croatia and Europe. The lagoon is thus frequented and inhabited by nesting, migratory and wintering birds who chose this area because of halophyte plants which offer optimal living and breeding conditions to swamp bird species. Bird watchers will get a chance to spot different species, including the rare black-winged stilt (*Himantopus himantopus*), which is on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species, the Kentish plover, grey plover, etc. The number of the endemic black-winged stilt breeding pairs visiting the lagoon annually has seen an increase. This is exciting news as this bird species population has dangerously decreased in the rest of Europe. Since being awarded the EDEN Award for the European Destination of Excellence

## Visit Šibenik

▶▶ The medieval, Mediterranean monastery garden "Sv. Lovre" (St. Lawrence) in Šibenik was renewed and opened in 2007 after having been forgotten for almost one hundred years. It is an integral part of the Franciscan monastery of "Sv. Lovre" and an integral part of the program scheme of the Šibenik private high school.

The renewal project was performed by the Croatian landscape architect Dragutin Kiš, the winner of the millennium award Flora in Japan in 2000. This garden is a rare sight for it represents the only monastery garden of its kind in Croatia. It follows the well-known medieval scheme: cross trail, a small well in the center, a simple parterre arrangement encircled by boxwood and marvelous, old and fragrant roses. Medicinal plants and pot herbs are planted in four fields.

A special place belongs to the collection of thyme with beautiful red, purple, grey and light and dark green leaves. The combination of colors makes the collection a sensation. Another interesting sight are the capers.

Legend says that capers were brought to Šibenik by Juraj Dalmatinac. Capers are planted in the hollows of walls and remind us of that great builder.
